





= feeling of safety


- Urban fortifications for storing and protecting food surpluses
  - human habitats, warfare, and architecture changed
- Plow favors men as farmers due to the upper body strength needed to use it
  - ideologies about the respective value of the sexes
- Certain forms of animal domestication, altering the relationship between humans and the natural world
  - difficult to appreciate an animal if it must be beaten all day to pull a plow




- Ease of labor

- People create more fake material, and it spreads faster
  - Global decline in trust
- The use of AI favors certain types of workers
  - Ideologies about the relative value of different professions are changing
- “Taming” AI
  - Human relationships evolve as a chatbot might become closer than any other person (= synthetic relationships)
- Automated lobbying, automated cyberattacks, automated extortion, automated exploitation of loopholes
  - AI automates morally charged tasks and responsibilities

Any new human-made tool has the potential to shape what is considered to be valuable and why.






