




# Landscape Analysis of Green Skills Training and Education in North & Sub-Saharan Africa

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# Overview & Method



We visited 5 countries to understand government TVET and Climate policy priorities and to identify TVET providers that could contribute to the just transition.

# State of TVET for Green Skills



- TVET sectors still developing. Often challenges with infrastructure, equipment, human capacity. Governance that struggles to link to industry. *Ultimately, often low quality and few graduates placed in jobs.*
- This is even more true for green skills.
- Policies in place both for green transition and for TVET ; Cases of recent support from development partners.
- Morocco more advanced. Others have nascent moves towards greening of TVET and green skills development.

# Aligned Development Programs & Promising Practices



- Employer led partnerships
  - *PropelA Project* (Kenya). Swiss dual training in construction sector with employers. Two Kenya WorldSkills winners. 80% job placement.
  - *Danish Industries* (Kenya). Focus on solid waste management. Links to international and domestic companies. Sector skills councils.
  - *Pact for Skills* (Ghana). Green Building and Biodigester Construction. 282 graduates in 3 years. WBL with German firm. Small pilot for migration to Germany.
- Promoting Green Entrepreneurship :
  - Electro-Recycling Ghana. TVET + introductions to international investors with seed funding for sales booths to young entrepreneurs.
