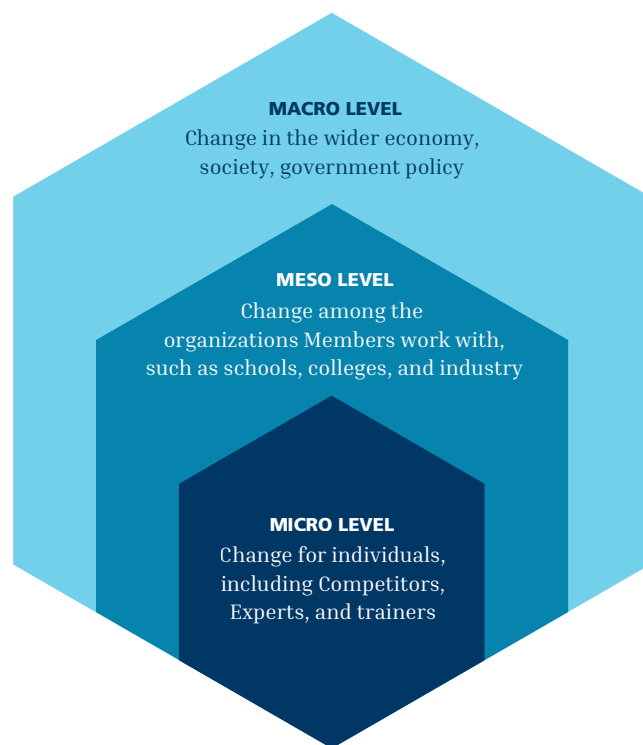


Driving system-level impact with WorldSkills

What is system-level impact?

System-level impact means change that reaches beyond the competition floor into a country or a region's wider skills system. Research from the WorldSkills Global Research Council has identified that this change happens at three levels: macro, meso and micro (see model, right). It represents impact that spans broader shifts in the economy, society, and government policy; impact among the organizations that WorldSkills Members work with; and impact for individuals themselves.

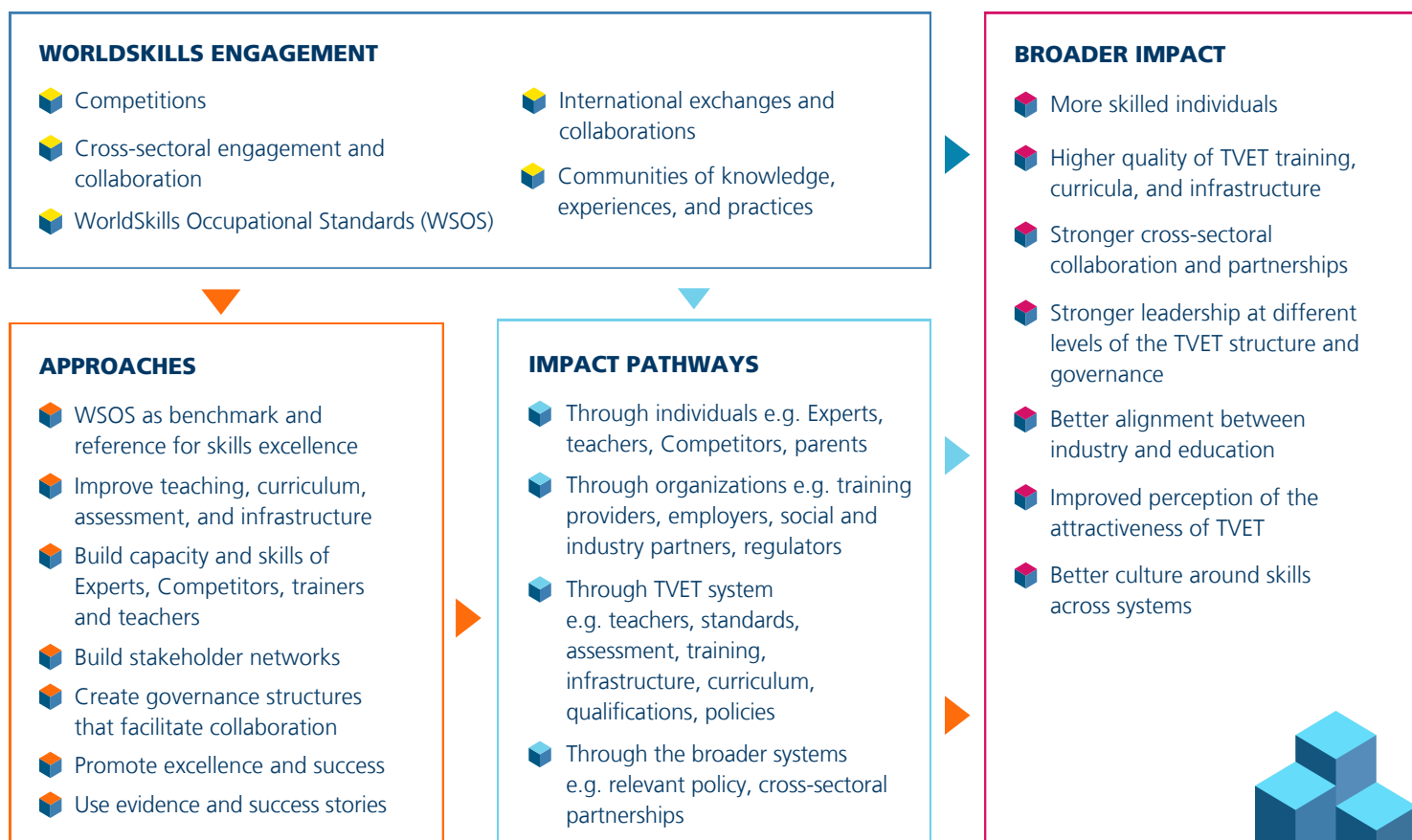


WorldSkills impact at the macro, meso, and micro levels (Xie and Robson, 2024)

The seven common dimensions to drive system-level impact

1. The strategic value of engagement with WorldSkills and skills competitions
2. Placing Competitors, Experts, trainers, and teachers at the centre of impact
3. Standards as a core tool for impact
4. System dynamics and organizational positioning
5. Stakeholder engagement and alignment across the system
6. The role of success stories and impact research in gaining stakeholder buy-in
7. The role of leadership at different levels of the system
