The continued growth of WorldSkills attests to the fact that traditional trade skills along with the newer technology multi-skilled vocations make an essential contribution to the economic and social well-being of people everywhere. As a free standing, non-political organization, WorldSkills provides a cost effective means for global government, education, and industry cooperation in achieving higher standards and status for vocational education and training on a worldwide basis.

THE WORLDSKILLS COMPETITION

Over its 60-year history, WorldSkills has come to symbolize the pinnacle of excellence in vocational education and skills promotion. Every two years, over a thousand young skilled professionals, accompanied by their teachers and trainers, gather from around the world to compete before the public in their various skills and test themselves against demanding international standards. They represent the best of their peers drawn from regional and national skill competitions held throughout the world.

The experience and results of all the competitions provide valuable feedback both to the individuals and the systems and enterprises in which they are being trained. For some it means recognition for outstanding achievement, while for others it provides the motivation and knowledge to aspire to higher standards. For the onlookers it is a revealing experience to see highly competent and skilled young people in action. The Competition is particularly effective in the context of providing positive career role models for school-aged youth and provides a unique means of exchange and comparison of world-class competency standards in the industrial skills and service sectors of the global economy.
