## WorldSkills Shizuoka 2007

The 39<sup>th</sup> WorldSkills Competition (WSC) and 7<sup>th</sup> International Abilympics (IA) will be jointly organised in Shizuoka, November 2007 under the banner of International Skills Festival for All, Japan 2007. The event accredits 3,452 people from 63 countries/regions which include 836 competitors from 47 countries/regions for WSC and 425 contestants from 28 countries/regions for IA. The confluence of both Competition will be the first time in the history of these two events. The joint opening will take place on Wednesday 14 November, followed by four days of competition at the WorldSkills Competition site in Numazu City and 3 days of competition at the International Abilympics site in Shizuoka City.

The 39<sup>th</sup> WorldSkills Competition (WSC2007) will become the largest WorldSkills Competition in history with a significant increase in the number of countries/regions, competitors and also delegates which include judges, official delegates, technical delegates, official observers, observers, team leaders and interpreters. The WSC2007 showcases 47 skills categories and concurrently the IA showcases 26 vocational skills and 6 leisure & living skills. The event will be an impressive display of skilled champions on the world stage.
