### French nationals in Nantes

The French National Competition, which took place in Nantes on 20-22 January, was a great success. 600 competitors, selected from 5000 youngsters from all over France, competed in 48 skills over three days. The event attracted 100,000 visitors, who crowded round the stands to observe the work of the competitors. Visitors could visit the "salon d'orientation", to get further information on a specific skill. The French team who will represent France in the WorldSkills Competition was formed at the Closing Ceremony at Airbus in Saint Mazaire.

Marie-Thérèse Geffroy, President of COFOM (Comité Français des Olympiades des Métiers) says: "We thank this success to the 22 regions of France, to all sponsor partners of the "Olympiades" and to all the experts and juries. This enthusiasm is needed to convince those who are not convinced yet of the genuine dynamic contribution to vocational education. So let's all meet in May in Helsinki and have a look at skills for young people who want to go for it!"

### FinnSkills Competition in Turku

The Finnish national competition, FinnSkills took place on 19-21 January. This huge event also attracted around 100 foreign competitors. Some of the competitors were already selected in their countries to compete in Helsinki in May 2005, so this event was an excellent chance for them to test machines and equipment. The Turku event was also an opportunity to do a 'test run' the upcoming WorldSkills Competition. WorldSkills representatives attended the competition very actively where the main focus was on testing the Competition Information System (CIS). The Chairman of the Technical Committee Liam Corcoran, the Secretary General David Hoey and the Marking Systems Advisor Peter Neate were very pleased to see the progress and results so far. It was clear that the Finnish CIS-team from Hämeenlinna Polytechnics had been developing the CIS according to plan. In addition, WorldSkills and Skills Finland also discussed issues on accreditation, internal communication during the competition, security, Global Skills Village, WorldSkills Leaders Forum and the Competition schedule.

Alongside the pressroom there is a press conference room with over 100 seats and a separate interview room. The accredited media will have free entry to the competition venue as well as to the Opening and Closing Ceremony. Entry to each particular skill competition site requires prior approval of the chief expert for that skill. ### Theme music of WorldSkills 2005 Helsinki

The Competition for the theme music of the WorldSkills Competition in May, was arranged by Skills Finland, the Conservatoire Association of Finland and the Helsinki Pop & Jazz Conservatory. 11 participants competed and five of them were qualified for the finals. The jury was faced with a difficult decision because all finalists were extremely good. However, the jury finally succeeded in making a tough decision. The winner of the theme music for the WorldSkills 2005 Competition is composer Vili Ollila with his piece "Sound Vision". Vili Ollila studies at the Helsinki Pop & Jazz Conservatory at Arabianranta. He is one of the brightest Finnish music talents of his generation. This composition was chosen for its freshness and originality. It also suits the competition image very well. Three versions of the theme music are now available. Sound Vision's premiere was at the Closing Ceremony of the FinnSkills Competition in Turku, where the Team representing Finland in May at the WorldSkills Competition was introduced.

# Mascot for WorldSkills 2005 Helsinki: SKILLY!

The need for a mascot had been in the planning process since summer 2004. The mascot has been created by architect, Mrs. Tanja Karpasto and Mr. Esa Ylä-Anttila. Esa Ylä-Anttila had earlier won the mascot competition for the 10th IAAF World Championships Helsinki in Athletics. Skilly symbolises diligence, internationalism, youth, goodwill and cheerfulness. The general competition graphical image is primary blue thus the vivid yellow colour creates a good counter-balance to it. Skilly will absolutely oil the wheels of Competition spirit. 


# WSC2005 Competition preparation
