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# THE POWER OF SKILLS

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### Skills keep the world working.

"...It's the global currency of the 21st century." Angel Gurria, OECD Secretary General

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- ALMOST 40% of employers report recruitment difficulties due to the lack of the right skills for entrylevel vacancies (OECD 2012, McKinsey 2012).
- 58% OF YOUTH say that practical, hands-on learning is an effective approach to training (McKinsey 2012).
- Predicted GLOBAL SHORTAGE of skilled workers in 2020 = 85 million (McKinsey, 2012).
- The world is likely to have too few high-skilled workers and not enough jobs for low-skilled workers (McKinsey- manufacturing-future-2013).
- Low employability of graduates and demand outpacing supply are the key factors driving the global shortage of skilled workers (Manpower Group, 2012).
- 75 million unemployed young workers (15-24) in 2010 (McKinsey, 2012).
- As in 2012, skilled trades vacancies are the hardest to fill at a global level (Manpower Group, 2013).

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- Skill shortages restrict economic growth and investment while unemployment is not only an economic burden but also brings distress and hardship to society (Hays Global Skill Shortage Index 2012).
- 360 million older workers are likely to exit the global labour force by 2030, creating challenging dependency ratios (International Labor Organization, 2012).
- Unemployment rates are lower among individuals with vocational upper secondary or post-secondary non-tertiary education: 7.4% compared with 8.4% among adults with a general upper secondary education (OECD, 2013).

## WHAT IS THE WORLDSKILLS CHAMPIONS TRUST?

The WorldSkills Champions Trust is an initiative developed by Champions for Champions as part of the WorldSkills Champions Forum 2014 in Lucerne, Switzerland. The WorldSkills Champions Trust consists of a group of Champions working together to help bridge the gap between Champions and WorldSkills beyond the Competition. This group works to help raise levels of engagement amongst WorldSkills Champions and promote active involvement in WorldSkills and WorldSkills Foundation projects, initiatives and activities.

## **HOW DOES IT WORK?**

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The WorldSkills Champions Trust is a group of nine Champions representing the skills and regions of WorldSkills. Champions are eligible to sit on the Trust if they have competed within the last three WorldSkills Competitions. These nine Champions will be appointed to a two-year term with the possibility to extend for another two-year term. During these two years, Champions will participate in training to become active WorldSkills advocates, engage Champions to develop and participate in projects, and participate in WorldSkills working group meetings to create a dialogue between WorldSkills and Champions.
