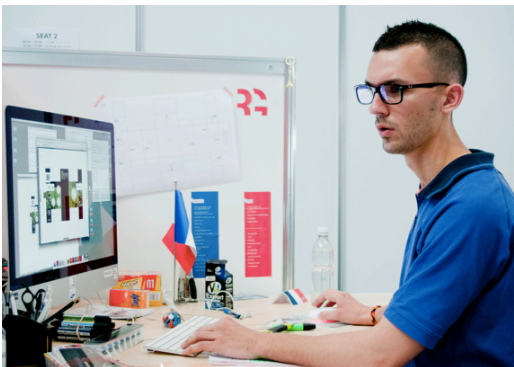

October 10 is World Homeless Day

Homelessness is an issue worldwide affecting developed and developing countries

It is estimated that 100 million people are homeless worldwide



POTENTIAL CHARITIES

“If you compare life in the tents, and now life in these shelters, it’s a thousand times better; there is no comparison”

Crisis is the national charity for homeless people.

- ✓ enabled housing projects and helped 8,123 single homeless people make a home in a private rented sector

Goal Global

- ✓ April 2015, Nepal was struck with a devastating series of earthquakes. 8898 people died and 20,000 injured. Over a few months goal provided humanitarian assistance and shelter.

OzHarvest

- ✓ Collects quality, excess food from commercial outlets and delivers it direct to 800 charities.



DIGITAL DESIGN CHALLENGE PROCESS

- A digital design challenge will take place, where anyone can participate worldwide.
- The challenge is to design a shelter for a developing country or refurbish an existing run down building in a developed country.
- They would try to utilize local resources and materials to design either shelters or existing buildings to be sustainable.
- The top four designs will be chosen to be created at WorldSkills 2017 Abu Dhabi.
- Champions will be involved to make the four models to be shown on display.
- Public can vote for the best design on the final day of the Competition
- The winning design will then be implemented

- Involve the local community in the building process also to get the homeless people involved for them to gain the knowledge and to use our skills to better themselves
- Once built or redeveloped, it can then be self sustainable by the homeless people and the community themselves

- The refugee crisis in Rwanda.
- In Rwanda about 70% of 81,000 Burundian refugees are living in emergency shelters.
- Every month an additional 1,000 to 3,000 refugees arrive in these areas

Support existing charities to empower refugees to become self sustainable through skills exchange.

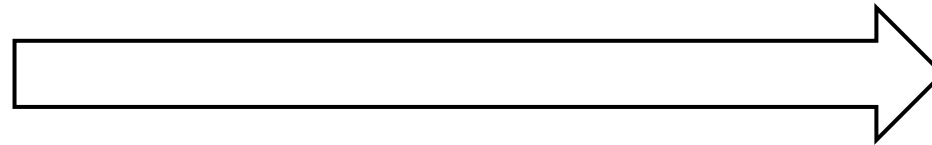

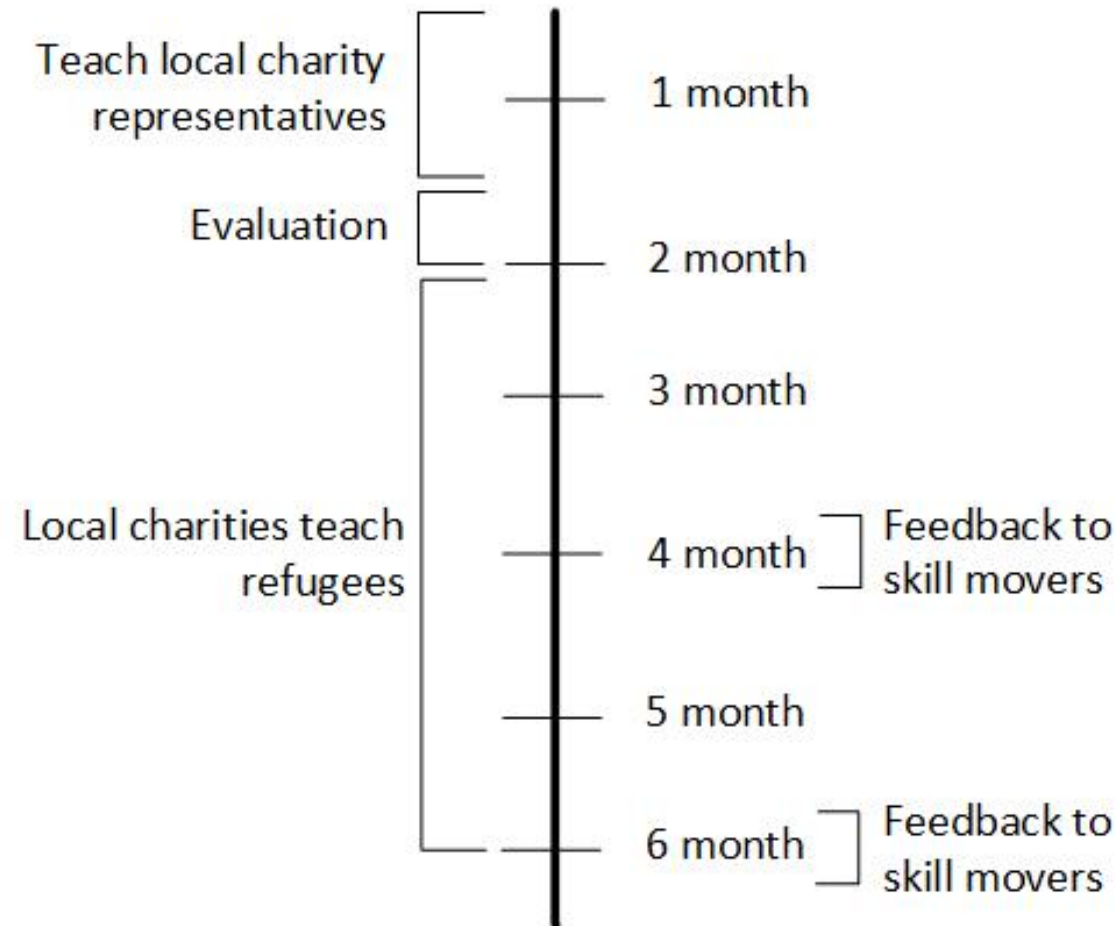

EXPENSES AND REVENUE

- Skill champions expenses
 - ☐ 10-12 champions per trip
 - ☐ travel (return flights per trip 2 000 pp)
 - ☐ accommodation (150 dollars a night)
 - ☐ food (30 dollars a day pp)
 - ✓ Total approximate cost per trip: 34 000
- Infrastructure expenses (could be provided by local partners)
 - ☐ Material costs (healthcare, plumbing, construction/carpentry)
 - ☐ Logistics



CHAMPIONS INVOLVEMENT

- Skill champions can share expertise in specific skill areas.
- Volunteer for periods of up to 8 weeks
- Involve future competitors as part of training.





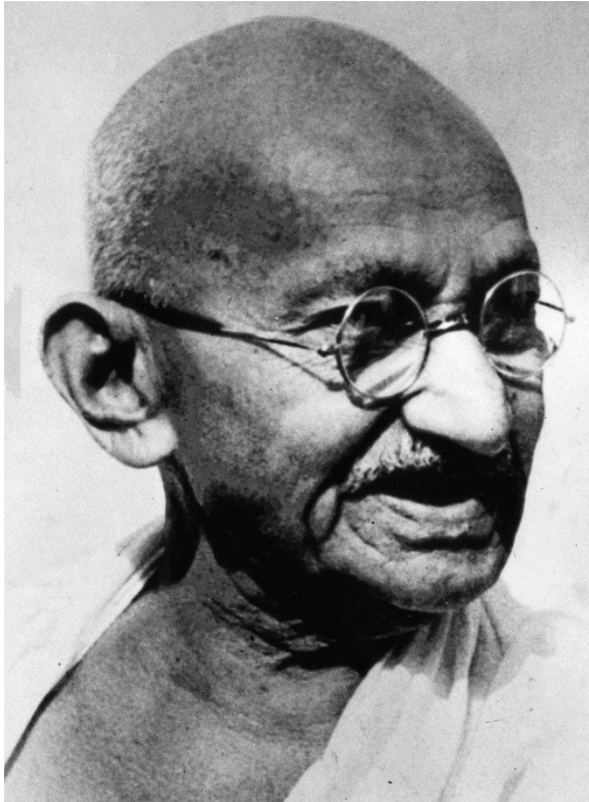

Examples of what WorldSkills is already doing

- Car Painting—Skills Canada 2014
 - Approximately 12 Competitors
 - Four pieces of cars per person
 - Donated to schools
 - Sanded and reused to train in the skill

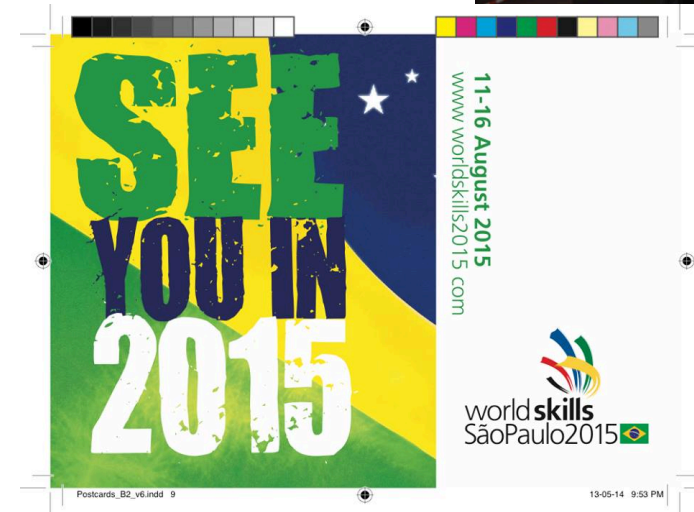




HOW TO INCORPORATE SUSTAINABLE PRACTICES

- Print Media Technology—Leipzig 2013
 - Sustainability Award
 - All good printed materials used
 - All waste printed materials recycled
 - Promotional materials for São Paulo 2015





HOW TO INCORPORATE SUSTAINABLE PRACTICES

Ideas from the 2016 Olympic Games

- Food donation during local and international events

- Waste food from Olympic Village
- Created 5,000+ meals per day
- International chefs trained local residents
- WorldSkills organizations can replicate
- Local and international





HOW TO INCORPORATE SUSTAINABLE PRACTICES

- Usable and/or reusable test projects
 - Projects such as landscape gardening, bricklaying, etc. can be donated to host cities of events
 - Projects from fashion technology, jewellery, and other competitions can be auctioned for funding for local charities

 - Create an online forum
 - Past Competitors
 - Experts
 - Plan and implement green ideas
 - Local, national, and international skills events
